



GPIA Visitor Pass Terms of Use

The GPIA Visitor Pass Program is for the personal use and enjoyment of Glacier Park International Airport, also known as GPIA, by allowing non-traveling visitors to greet friends and family arriving on domestic flights, to escort traveling family members and friends to their gates, to shop and dine at the wonderful restaurants and gift shop post-security, to watch the magic of aircraft arriving and departing, or to participate in GPIA-sponsored events.

GPIA Visitor Pass access is approved only for personal use; commercial or professional use is prohibited. The Flathead Municipal Airport Authority (FMAA) and/or the Transportation Security Administration (TSA) may deny or revoke access at any time in its sole discretion.

For airport-badged personnel, the program cannot be used as an alternative for security clearance when arriving for work in the airport areas beyond security. Failure to adhere to these terms may lead to the imposition of a fine and revocation of badged access.

Entry is not permitted before the approved start time. Operating times may vary, and not all shops, restaurants or amenities may be open during your visit.

To be considered for GPIA Visitor Pass entry to GPIA, all applicants and any minors (meaning individuals aged 18 and younger) will be required to provide certain personal information that will be used by the TSA to conduct background checks. If there is a discrepancy or possible match in the database, the visit will be denied. All applicants should carefully read the TSA Privacy Act Statement below and consider the implications of providing their personal information. Additionally, information submitted to FMAA may be subject to Public Records Requests.

Users of the GPIA Visitor Pass are subject to the same security regulations as passengers boarding aircraft per TSA regulations. Please review TSA's **list of prohibited items** prior to your arrival at the airport.

All travelers aged 18 and younger must always be accompanied by an adult GPIA Visitor Pass participant.

GPIA Visitor Pass participants shall be subject to these terms of the GPIA Visitor Pass Program (including the requirements and restrictions set forth in the **Frequently Asked Questions**, all GPIA Rules and Regulations, including those pertaining to public use of the Airport, as well as

all local, state and federal laws and regulations. Any person or persons who refuse to comply with these applicable terms, rules, regulations and laws may be regarded as a trespasser.

PLEASE REVIEW THE FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS FOR FURTHER INFORMATION AND RESTRICTIONS. BY APPLYING TO PARTICIPATE IN THE GPIA VISITOR PASS PROGRAM ALL PARTICIPANTS ACKNOWLEDGE THAT THEY HAVE REVIEWED AND AGREED TO COMPLY WITH THE ABOVE TERMS OF THE BNA PASSPORT PROGRAM AND THE REQUIREMENTS AND RESTRICTIONS SET FORTH IN THE FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS.

TSA PRIVACY ACT STATEMENT

AUTHORITY: 49 U.S.C. § 114(f). PRINCIPAL PURPOSE(S): This information is collected by airport operators or their representatives in order to conduct checks of TSA's Secure Flight watch lists on individuals who wish to access the Sterile Area at Glacier Park International Airport, also known as GPIA, which is located beyond the screening checkpoint. TSA may receive this information from airport operators or their representatives in order to resolve suspected or actual matches to this database. **ROUTINE USE(S):** TSA may share this information with aircraft and airport operators, foreign air carriers, or appropriate Federal, State, or other agency regarding individuals who pose or are suspected of posing a risk to transportation or national security, or for other routine uses identified in TSA systems of records, DHS/TSA 019 Secure Flight Records. **DISCLOSURE:** Voluntary failure to furnish the requested information will result in your inability to access facilities located in the airport beyond the screening checkpoint.
